Keynote: Will Kenneth Burke's Perpetually Forthcoming "Symbolic" Ever Be Forthcoming?

DR. RICHARD H THAMES



A founder of the Kenneth Burke Society, Thames helped organize the original Burke conference in Philadelphia in 1984 and the centennial conference in Pittsburgh in 1996 at Duquesne. He edited the Society's *Newsletter* for over a decade and now serves on the Editorial Board of its online *KB Journal*. He has also served as an Associate Editor of the *Quarterly Journal of Speech*, 1998–2001, as well as a reader for numerous journals. Thames is recognized for interpreting Burke in terms of the Aristotelian organicism and naturalism Burke encountered at Columbia University in 1916. He is currently editing a critical edition of Burke's unpublished "Symbolic of Motives," which Burke allowed him to copy when he was

fortunate enough to study with Burke during his Visiting Mellon Professorship at the University of Pittsburgh in 1974; no further copies came to light until Burke's death in 1993. In conjunction with his studies of Burke, Thames' interests include the rhetoric of religion and the rhetoric of science & social science; the rhetoric of the marketplace and the rhetoric of popular culture; hermeneutics and criticism. He seeks to explore the rhetorical influence of ideas within and across historical periods, tracing the intellectual lineage of thinkers and examining how their ideas shape, maintain, and change beliefs in intellectual and popular culture.

MARIA DEL GUADALUPE DAVIDSON, 2022 JULIA T. WOOD AWARDEE



Lupe Davidson is Associate Dean for Social Justice, Faculty Development and Innovation for the Eberly College of Arts and Sciences and a Woodburn Professor of Women's and Gender Studies. Lupe received her Ph.D. in Rhetoric from Duquesne University. Previously she has been the L.J. Semrod Presidential Professor of Arts and Sciences, Associate Professor and Director of Women's and Gender Studies, Co-Director of the Women's and Gender Studies Center for Social Justice, Assistant Professor and Interim Director of Business Communication and Assistant Professor of African American Studies at the University of Oklahoma. Her teaching interests include Black feminist theory, Rhetorical theory and criticism and Africana philosophical thought.

She is the author of *Black Women, Agency, and the New Black Feminism*. Davidson has coedited a number of collections including *College Curriculum at the Crossroads: Women of Color Reflect and Resist* and *Convergences: Black Feminism and Continental Philosophy*.

In 2017, she was the recipient of the Black Girls Rock—Maria del Guadalupe Davidson Rock Star Award, named in her honor, and the Women's and Gender Studies Jill Irvine Leadership Award. She has led a study abroad course in Uganda on *Women Creating Social Change*, related to her interdisciplinary, collaborative research in the region. Her co-edited book *Our Black Sons Matter: Mothers Talk about Fears, Sorrows and Hopes* (with George Yancey and Susan Hadley) was named one of the American Library Association's "Top 10 Diverse Nonfiction Books of 2016."

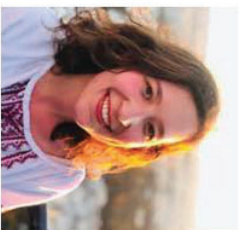

- ☞ **Julia T. Wood Teacher/Scholar Award** recognizes achievements of a Pennsylvania related teacher/scholar whose outstanding service and contributions are highly visible and influential on students and fellow scholars alike.
- ☞ **The Pennsylvania Communication Association Speaker of the Year Award** honors Pennsylvanians who excel at public speaking.
- ☞ **The Robert T. Oliver Lifetime Achievement Award** recognizes contributions of an outstanding PCA member at, during, or near retirement. The award honors people in various aspects of communication within which members ordinarily work.
- ☞ **The Carroll Arnold Distinguished Service Award** recognizes contributions of a PCA member to the profession and/or to PCA. The award could be for long and faithful service, outstanding teaching, distinctive service, and/or a single outstanding contribution.
- ☞ **The Donald Ecroyd Research and Scholarship Award** recognizes a PCA member who has a commitment to and a sustained record of research and publication in the field of communication.
- ☞ **The Harvey Kelly Excellence in Teaching Award** recognizes a PCA member who has demonstrated a passion for and a mastery of teaching, both in and out of the classroom. The award could be for innovative methods in the classroom, community-based education, demonstrated impact, lifetime accomplishment, or a single exceptional accomplishment.
- ☞ **The Voices of Tomorrow College Communicator of the Year Award** recognizes excellent communicators at the college level. This award is presented to a Pennsylvania college student who excels in curricular and extracurricular communication (including speech or media) work, who uses communication skills in a service capacity, and who demonstrates promise of future leadership through communication.
